State Program Manager Heather Jones to speak on the impact of broadband across the state, barriers to adoption

Columbia, SC – On Tuesday, February 4, Connect South Carolina will be featured at the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce Competitive Agenda Series – Infrastructure forum in Columbia. At the forum, attendees can expect to revisit what happened in 2013, learn what 2014 holds, learn the needs of distribution facilities, explore the future of S.C.'s inland port, and hear how current policy affects the port, rail and transit, infrastructure, and broadband.

Heather Jones, state program manager and community technology advisor for Connect South Carolina, will discuss broadband and the impact it has on the state and various sectors vital to the region, as well as the barriers to adoption and what can be done to help get the 1.2 million unconnected South Carolinians connected to broadband. Also on the broadband panel is Ted Creech, director of external affairs with AT&T South Carolina.

“I am thankful to be part of this South Carolina Chamber of Commerce event and excited to co-host this panel on broadband with Ted Creech,” said Jones. “As the state’s broadband initiative, Connect South Carolina has gathered data that shows not only the importance of broadband adoption but also what we can do to help get the 1.2 million South Carolinians who are disconnected connected to broadband and the world beyond. Broadband adoption and digital literacy are two important issues we must overcome in order to compete globally and I look forward to the opportunity to share our research and open up the discussion.”
